
EPHEMERA: INTERNATIONAL FEMALE PERSPECTIVES IN COLLAGE



In addition to showcasing the work of senior students, exhibitions by visiting artists, invitational and juried exhibitions are displayed. The Art Gallery is a resource for the department, campus and Wilmington community. A public reception is held for each exhibit and all exhibitions are free and open to the public.

The Art Gallery is on the ground floor of the Cultural Arts Building, near the building's main entrance. The Cultural Arts Building is located on the corner of Randall Parkway and Reynolds Drive on the UNCW campus and can be accessed from South College Road or Racine Drive.
