Need-to-Know Sexual Health Tidbits

Abstinence = most effective way to protect self from STD's & unwanted pregnancy.

Bacterial STD's
The CURABLES,
 but **ONLY** w/ Treatment

Chlamydia
 Gonorrhea
 Syphilis

Viral STD's
The INCURABLES
 Can be managed w/ meds

Herpes
HPV
HIV
Hepatitis B

If you can't talk about sex, you shouldn't be having it! Talk protection, sexual history, & when he/she was last tested— **BEFORE** engaging in sexual activity! Embarrassed? It's more embarrassing to "acquire" an STD or child because you were too embarrassed to ask!

Hormonal contraceptives include:

- Birth control pills
- Vaginal ring (Nuva Ring)
- Skin Patch (Ortho Evra)
- Depo-Provera shot
- IUD (Intrauterine Device)

*When used perfectly all are very effective at preventing pregnancy but will **NOT** protect against **ANY** STD's

Human Error is the #1 reason contraceptives fail. If you choose to be sexually active, know how to use a condom and dental dam, & understand how hormonal contraceptives work!

Plan B, aka the morning after pill, is available at the Abrons Student Health Center Pharmacy for \$35. UNCW females and males 18 and older may obtain over the counter. Females 17 and under need to see a provider to obtain Plan B.

Condoms & abstinence are the **ONLY** two methods that can help protect against pregnancy **AND** STD's!

Avoid mixing alcohol and sexual activity. Drug and alcohol abuse interferes with decision making which can lead to date rape, forgetting to use protection, unplanned pregnancy, and/or contracting an STD.
