The Department of Creative Writing at UNCW is proud to present Writers Week, an annual symposium bringing nationally acclaimed writers (of fiction, creative nonfiction, and poetry) and a distinguished keynote speaker, in addition to publishers, literary agents, and editors, to our UNCW campus. Writers Week activities include craft seminars, panel discussions, Q&A sessions, individual manuscript conferences for students, and public readings, receptions, and book signings; thus providing an opportunity for our students and community members to concentrate on writing, to communicate with one another, and to celebrate the art of literature in a way that no single event can match. Writers' Week enables us to emphasize cultural diversity in writing and helps make our program a hub of literary activity in our region. Events are free and panels, talks, and readings are open to the public.
