⁴If student graduated high school more than 7 years ago **or** is taking a different language than studied in high school, they can take another course in the "Additional General Education Courses" category at the community college. If student graduated high school within last 7 years and is taking same language as high school or did not have at least two foreign language courses in high school, then they must take the same FL through 201 level at the CC or at UNCW. UNCW recommends that transfer students complete the Foreign Language Requirements prior to enrolling at UNCW. A student who chooses to wait on the FL requirement should consult with their advisor about satisfying the FL requirement at UNCW.

THIS SHEET IS FOR ADVISING PURPOSES ONLY. Students should work with their Advisor to determine course selections that will result in the greatest transferrable credit, for the intended program, upon transfer to the four-year school. Please remember that C-'s do not transfer to UNCW.
