<sup>7</sup>If student graduated high school more than 7 years ago or is taking a different language than studied in high school, they can take another course in the Global Awareness & FL category at the community college. If student graduated high school within last 7 years and is taking same language as high school or did not have at least two foreign language courses in high school, then they must take the same FL through 201 level at the CC or at UNCW. UNCW recommends that transfer students complete the Foreign Language Requirements prior to enrolling at UNCW. A student who chooses to wait on the FL requirement should consult with their advisor about satisfying the FL requirement at UNCW.

\*These courses will also count towards UNCW Elementary Education Concentration.

**THIS SHEET IS FOR ADVISING PURPOSES ONLY.** Students should work with their Advisor to determine course selections that will result in the greatest transferrable credit, for the intended program, upon transfer to the four-year school. Please remember that C-'s do not transfer to UNCW.

- The elementary education program is part of Watson College of Education's Professional Development School Partnership. Alongside methods courses, students complete field experience hours in local partnership schools.
- As students navigate the program, the number of hours in local schools increases with the final semester including a full semester long internship in a local school.
- All students completing the program must pass the EdTPA assessment in order to be recommended for licensure in North Carolina.
- The program strongly recommends taking the foundations of reading exam (NCEL) at the end of the second semester of the junior year and the math licensure exam (Praxis or NCEL) at the end of the first semester of senior year.
