Schedule for Full-Time Students

Pursuing AA Degree & transfer into Middle Grades Education - Math Concentration (BA) at UNCW.

North Carolina Community College classes are listed below in bold with (AA Requirement Sections). The UNCW degree requirements fulfilled listed next to the classes.

The University of North Carolina at Wilmington **strongly recommends** students complete their Associate's degree prior to transferring to UNCW. Pathways are structured for students who have completed all requirements for their Associate's degree and qualify for the CAA. UNCW recommends that transfer students complete the Foreign Language Requirements prior to enrolling at UNCW.

All middle-grades majors must select a 24-hour concentration field in addition to an 18-hour teaching field. Areas for both include: Language Arts, Social Studies, Math and Science

If student graduated high school within last 7 years and is taking same language as high school or did not have at least two foreign language courses in high school, then they must take the same FL through 201 level at the CC or at UNCW. UNCW recommends that transfer students complete the Foreign Language Requirements prior to enrolling at UNCW. A student who chooses to wait on the FL requirement should consult with their advisor about satisfying the FL requirement at UNCW.
