⁵If student graduated high school more than 7 years ago **or** is taking a different language than studied in high school, they can take another course in the "Additional General Electives" category at the community college. If student graduated high school within last 7 years and is taking same language as high school or did not have at least two foreign language courses in high school, then they must take the same FL through 201 level at the CC or at UNCW. UNCW recommends that transfer students complete the Foreign Language Requirements prior to enrolling at UNCW. A student who chooses to wait on the FL requirement should consult with their advisor about satisfying the FL requirement at UNCW.
