

Summary of Eligibility, Source of Appointment, and Terms of Office, as of April 2022

Agnes Beane: appointed by the Board of Governors in 2015; reappointed in 2019; eligible to serve through 2023

Hugh Caison: appointed by the Speaker of the House in December 2021, to Woody White's unexpired term; eligible for reappointment in 2023; if reappointed, eligible for reappointment in 2027; if reappointed, eligible to serve through 2031

Jeff Clark: appointed by the Board of Governors in 2021; eligible for reappointment in 2025; if reappointed, eligible to serve through 2029

Malcomb Coley: appointed by the Board of Governors in 2021; eligible for reappointment in 2025; if reappointed, eligible to serve through 2029

Carlton Fisher: served from 2011 through 2015; appointed again by the Board of Governors in 2017; reappointed in 2021; eligible to serve through 2025

Holly Grange: appointed by the Speaker of the House in 2021; eligible for reappointment in 2025; if reappointed, eligible to serve through 2029

Gidget Kidd: appointed by the Board of Governors in November 2013, to David Swain's unexpired term; reappointed in 2015 and in 2019; eligible to serve through 2023

Chip Mahan: appointed by the Board of Governors in 2021; eligible for reappointment in 2025; if reappointed, eligible to serve through 2029

Hank Miller: appointed by the Board of Governors in 2015; reappointed in 2019; eligible to serve through 2023

Bob Rippy: appointed by the Senate President Pro Tempore in 2017; reappointed in 2021; eligible to serve through 2025

Yousry Sayed: appointed by the Board of Governors for a term beginning in 2019; eligible for reappointment in 2023; if reappointed, eligible to serve through 2027

Jimmy Tate: appointed by the Senate President Pro Tempore in March 2021, to fill the unexpired term of Michael Lee; eligible for reappointment in 2023; if reappointed, eligible for reappointment in 2027; if reappointed, eligible to serve through 2031
