

Summary of Eligibility, Source of Appointment, and Terms of Office, as of January 2018

Agnes Beane: appointed by the Board of Governors in 2015; eligible for reappointment in 2019; if reappointed, could serve through 2023

Dennis Burgard: appointed by the Governor in 2013; appointed by the Speaker of the House in 2017; eligible to serve through 2021

Wilma Daniels: appointed by the Board of Governors in 2008, to the unexpired term of Windell Daniels; reappointed in 2011; reappointed in 2015; eligible to serve through 2019

Michael Drummond: appointed by the Governor in 2013; appointed by the Board of Governors in 2017; eligible to serve through 2021

Carlton Fisher: served from 2011 through 2015; appointed again by the Board of Governors in 2017; eligible for reappointment in 2021; if reappointed, could serve through 2025

Gidget Kidd: appointed by the Board of Governors in November 2013, to David Swain's unexpired term; reappointed in 2015; eligible for reappointment in 2019; could serve through 2023

Hal Kitchin: appointed by the Board of Governors in 2013; reappointed in 2017; eligible to serve through 2021

Ronnie McNeill: appointed by the Governor in 2011; reappointed in 2015; eligible to serve through 2019

Hank Miller: appointed by the Board of Governors in 2015; eligible for reappointment in 2019; if reappointed, could serve through 2023

Bob Rippy: appointed by the President Pro Tempore in 2017; eligible for reappointment in 2021; if reappointed, could serve through 2025

Maurice Smith: appointed by the Board of Governors in 2013; reappointed in 2017; eligible to serve through 2021

Woody White: appointed by the Speaker of the House in 2018, to the unexpired term of Christopher Leonard; eligible for reappointment in 2019 (and 2023); if reappointed twice, could serve through 2027
