

ALFRED & ANITA SCHNOG TRAVEL AWARD FOR HOLOCAUST STUDIES

2019-2020 Student Travel Award Application

Application Deadline: November 15, 2019

Awards Announced: December 1, 2019

The Alfred and Anita Schnog Travel Award for Holocaust Studies provides grants of \$4,000 to travel to international sites in order to conduct faculty-mentored research into the societal, cultural, and geo-political forces that enabled the Holocaust to occur as well as its impact and legacy on human interactions. The award is available to UNCW juniors, seniors, or graduate students with a GPA of 3.0 or above. For the 2019/20 academic year, up to three awards will be granted.

Successful applicants will demonstrate how the proposed project will explore a component of the Holocaust and how the project relates to their academic interests and studies at UNCW. Those students granted Schnog Travel Awards, along with their faculty mentors, will meet with their fellow awardees before departing. After their return, awardees will provide written and/or oral presentations of their research to a university audience. All travel must be completed by August 15, 2020.

Application Materials and Instructions:

In consultation with a UNCW faculty mentor, include the following documents with your application:

- *Cover page (attached below)*
- *Project proposal (no more than 750 words) that includes:*
 - *topic of study*
 - *description of proposed research, travel, and dates*
 - *description of research methodology or creative activity*
 - *language skills, if applicable*
 - *anticipated outcome (such as a research paper, performance, or exhibit)*
- *Preliminary bibliography (no more than 8 items)*
- *Budget of projected expenses*
- *Recommendation from a UNCW faculty mentor. Faculty mentors must hold full-time appointments at UNCW.*

Submit completed application materials as an MS Word document (typed signature is acceptable) to your faculty mentor, who will forward them to the Chair of the Schnog Scholars Committee as a pdf file.
