Currently the Felton G. Clark Professor of Education at Southern University in Baton Rouge, Dr. Lisa D. Delpit is the former Executive Director/Eminent Scholar for the Center for Urban Education & Innovation at Florida International University in Miami and former holder of the Benjamin E. Mays Chair of Urban Educational Excellence at Georgia State University in Atlanta.

She is an internationally-known speaker and writer whose work has focused on the education of children of color and the perspectives, aspirations, and pedagogy of teachers of color. Her work on school-community relations and cross-cultural communication, particularly her award-winning first book, *Other People's Children*, was cited as a contributor to her receiving a MacArthur "Genius" Award in 1990. Her most recent book, published in 2012, is *"Multiplication is For White People": Raising Expectations for Other People's Children*.
