ENG Advanced Placement Tests

Whereas students scoring a 3 on the Advanced Placement Literature and Composition exam currently earn credit for ENG110, a course that also carries with it 3 hours of Writing Intensive credit;

Whereas students scoring a 4 on the Advanced Placement Language and Composition exam currently earn credit for ENG103, a course that also carries with it 3 hours of Information Literacy credit;

Whereas the Faculty Review Committee, serving under the auspices of the Transfer Work Group, reviewed College Board's materials describing both exams and determined that the Literature and Composition exam does address WI's Senate-approved Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) and the Language and Composition exam does address IL's Senate-approved SLOs;

Whereas allowing these scores set by the English department to count for both course content and WI/IL competency prevents students from having to seek out additional WI/IL courses upon enrolling at UNCW;

Whereas the Chair of English Department has been consulted on the proposal and supports the granting of competency credit at these scoring thresholds; and

Whereas the USAC voted in unanimous support of granting competency credit for exams meeting the current scoring thresholds;

Resolved that students scoring a 3 on the AP Literature and Composition exam earn 3 hours of WI credit, and students scoring a 4 on the AP Language and Composition exam earn 3 hours of IL credit.
