

University Honors Requirements

Honors University Studies classes are like general education classes, but taught as Honors version. Ex.: HON Chemistry 101. Each one is worth 3 credit hours.

As a transfer student, you are exempt from one of these course requirements.

For students with significant transfer credit, we will allow an honors contract class (see below) to substitute for one or two classes in this category.

To complete your 3 credit hours of Honors electives, you could take another HON University Studies class. You could take three HON 120 seminars. You could contract a class (get professor permission to do additional Honors work). Or get the requirement waived when you study abroad for a semester or take a graduate-level class.
