

REQUIREMENTS FOR A B.A. DEGREE IN SPANISH
(36 hours) Beginning fall 2011

I. A minimum of 30 semester hours chosen from the following:

- 302 Reading Strategies for Spanish** (prerequisite: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 202 or placement test score);
OR
- 315 Intermediate Spanish for Bilinguals II** (prerequisite: SPN 215 or by placement test); University Studies: Living in our Diverse Nation
- 303 Spanish Conversation** (prerequisite: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 302 or 315 or by placement test)
- 305 Spanish Composition** (prerequisite: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 302, SPN 303, or SPN 315); University Studies IV: Building Competencies/Writing Intensive.
- 306 Advanced Grammar** (prerequisite: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 302 or 315)
- 307 Phonetics** (prerequisite: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 302 or 315); Cluster: Linguistics
- 308 Hispanic Linguistics** (prerequisite: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 307); Cluster: Linguistics
- 310 Business Spanish** (prerequisite: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 305); Entrepreneurship Minor
- 311 Spanish Civilization** (prerequisites: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 305); University Studies: Living in a Global Society
- 312 Spanish-American Civilization** (prerequisites: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 305); University Studies: Living in a Global Society
- 321 Introduction to Spanish Literature** (prerequisites: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 305); University Studies: Aesthetic, Interpretive, & Literary Perspectives
- 322 Introduction to Spanish-American Literature** (prerequisites: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 305); University Studies: Aesthetic, Interpretive, & Literary Perspectives
- 323 Introduction to U.S. Latino Literature and Culture** (prerequisites: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 305); Cluster: Immigration; University Studies: Aesthetic, Interpretive, & Literary Perspectives; Living in a Diverse Nation
- 385 Introduction to Spanish Cinema**

II. A minimum of 6 semester hours chosen from the following:

- 401 Translation Techniques and Practices** (prerequisites: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 303 or 315 and SPN 306 and one additional Spanish course at the 300 level or above; and native or near-native command of written English)
- 405 Advanced Conversation and Composition** (prerequisite: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 305); University Studies IV: Building Competencies/Writing Intensive; Information Literacy
- 411 Topics in Spanish Civilization** (prerequisite: SPN 311 or equivalent); variable content; may be repeated under a different subtitle.
- 412 Topics in Spanish-American Civilization** (prerequisite: SPN 312 or equivalent); variable content; may be repeated under a different subtitle.
- 421 Studies in Spanish Literature** (prerequisite: SPN 321 or equivalent); variable content; may be repeated under a different subtitle.
- 422 Studies in Spanish-American Literature** (prerequisite: SPN 322 or equivalent); variable content; may be repeated under a different subtitle.
- 485 Seminar in Spanish Cinema** (prerequisite: A 300-level course in Spanish)
- 490 Service Learning and Research** (prerequisite: Prerequisite: SPN 305 and an additional 9 hours of SPN 300/400 level courses); Cluster: Immigration; University Studies: Explorations Beyond the Classroom; Building Competencies/Writing Intensive.
- 491 Directed Individual Study** (prerequisite: overall GPA of at least 2.00, junior or senior standing, and consent of instructor, department chairperson, and dean); University Studies V: Explorations Beyond the Classroom.
- 495 Seminar in Hispanic Studies** (prerequisite: A grade of “C” or better in SPN 321 or 322); variable content; may be repeated under a different subtitle.
- 496 Seminar in Hispanic Linguistics** (prerequisite: SPN 305, 306, and 307); variable content; may be repeated once under different subtitle; Cluster: Linguistics
- 497 Capstone Seminar** (prerequisite: senior standing and a minimum of 21 SPN hours at 300 level and 3 SPN hours at the 400 level); students will select a research paper from a previous class to develop into a final thesis project using appropriate research methods and editing techniques. Students will give an oral defense of the paper. Satisfies University Studies VI: Common Requirements/Capstone Course. Partially satisfies University Studies IV: Building Competencies/Writing Intensive. Partially satisfies University Studies IV: Building Competencies/Information Literacy.
- 498 Internship in Spanish** (prerequisite: junior standing, completion of at least 12 hours of course work in SPN at the 300 or 400 level and consent of instructor); University Studies: Explorations Beyond the Classroom
- 499 Honors Work in Spanish** (prerequisite: eligibility for honors program and senior standing); University Studies: Explorations Beyond the Classroom.

II. Applied Learning Requirement: This requirement can be met by completing 3 credits in one of the following: SPN 490, SPN 491, SPN 498, or SPN 499; or 6 credits of study abroad in Spanish at the intermediate level or above; or EDN 409 for Teacher Licensure Students.

Further Explanation for Spanish Majors:

- One 400-level course may be substituted for one of the required 300-level courses.
- For requirements for a Major in Spanish for the B.A. degree with Teacher Licensure, see the separate worksheet.
- All classes, with the exception of SPN 491, 495 and 499 are for 3 hours of credit. SPN 491 and 495 may be taken for 1-3 credits. SPN 499 may be taken for 2-3 credits.
- Only 3 credits total permissible in 491 and 498 to count toward the major
