INTERDEPARTMENTAL INITIATIVES IN TEACHING

- 2019 Developed and facilitated Study Abroad program Religion & Identity in Russia in collaboration with International Studies department. The program provides an extraordinary opportunity to explore and learn about modern Russia and Russia's unique contribution to the world culture and diversity. Utilizing a cross disciplinary approach, students will explore the intellectual and cultural history of Russia with an emphasis on religion and social life. Program allowed students enrolled in RUS 294 Topics in Russian Study: Study abroad, INT 340: Topics in Europe: Religion in Europe or PAR 230 - Judaism, Christianity and Islam. The INT 340 course will be taught by International Studies department faculty.
