ADVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES

Be accessible during office hours in person, by telephone, or email

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

Attend regular appointments and make regular contact with your advisor each semester by email and phone

Be an active learner by coming prepared to each appointment with questions and/or materials for discussion

Be open to developing and clarifying your personal values and goals

Complete all recommendations from your advisor

Research majors, minors, policies, procedures and opportunities as appropriate

Utilize advising tools to track your academic progress and goals

Accept responsibility for your decisions and actions

Regularly check UNCW email account for official communication

August & January

- Add/drop classes from your schedule before the deadline
- Schedule an introduction meeting with your advisor via email
- Review all academic policies provided in the undergraduate catalogue
- 🌿 Review and finalize process for transfer credit (AP/IB and college credits)
- 🌿 Contact advisor if you change your schedule or have questions
- 🌿 Review your course syllabi

September & February

- Schedule your registration advising meeting with your Academic Advisor via the online calendar
- Choose 5 classes for next semester and several alternatives
- Prepare for your registration advising appointment (look at your degree audit, university studies curriculum and major program sheets)
- 🌿 Meet with professors during their office hours
- 🌿 Visit the University Learning Center for assistance in preparing for exams, tutoring, math or writing

October & March

- Find your registration time ticket on SeaNet
- Speak with your advisor if you plan to withdraw from a class
- 🌿 Schedule an appointment with a Career Counselor
- 🌿 Talk with instructors about midterm grades
- 🌿 Predict your GPA with the GPA Calculator on mySeaPort or Degree Works

November & April

- Register for classes
- Confirm date, time and location for all final exams
- 🌿 Contact advisor with any class scheduling questions

December & May

- Check final grades on SeaNet

- 🌿 Make an appointment with your Academic Advisor if needed
